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CHAPTER 1

INTRODUCTION & METHODOLOGY

With nearly 800 universities and over 40,000 colleges, Indian higher education system is undoubtedly the largest system of higher education found anywhere in the world. With total enrolment crossing 33 Million, Indian higher education system is only second to China.

Going by the demographic trends and rapid expansion, it will soon become the single largest system of higher education in the world. Going by the policy framework which enables universities and colleges to admit foreign/ NRI/ PIO/OCI students up to 15 percent of their sanctioned intake, India should have been having about 4.85 million foreign/NRI/PIO students studying in its campuses.

As against this vast potential, the number of international students in the country has been only in thousand. The data collected as in September 2016 shows that there were only 30,423 international students across all universities and higher educational institutions in the country as compared to 31,126 international students reported a year earlier.

Concerned about the low numbers of international students in our campuses, the AIU has been collecting and disseminating the data on yearly basis in the form of an Annual Occasional Paper to sensitise the academic community, the

policy planners and regulators in higher education. These occasional papers are based on the data collected by the AIU from its member universities. The present document is the continuation of the activity but this year the occasional paper is wider in scope and coverage as it also presents not only some critical data on global trends in internationalisation as available from secondary sources but also the data on the programme-wise distribution of international students. Besides, the present occasional paper also provides number of international students pursuing their programmes of studies as a full time regular students and also those who studied short-term courses.

Given the importance of internationalisation and inflow of students in India, the AIU has been conducting an annual survey of international students in Indian universities and has been reporting data and analysis of international students in India since 1995. For the purpose, AIU has developed a data collection tool which is sent to all universities in the country. AIU does persistent follow up to ensure that responses are received from the maximum number of universities in the country.

This year the data collection tool was despatched to the member universities in March 2016 and the member

universities were requested to report the number of international students on their campuses, including those enrolled in the colleges affiliated thereto by September 2016. In order to avoid any ambiguity, the universities were requested to report the total number of international students that were on their roll during the academic session 2014-15.

The data collection tool was dispatched to 593 universities/university level institutions. This was followed by two reminders and repeated phone calls requesting the universities to expedite the submission of information. In all 341 universities/university level institutions responded with 133 universities furnishing nil information. The data so received from 208 universities/university level institutions was compiled and collated. These include 17 central universities, 16 institutions of national importance, 79 public funded state universities, 41 self-financed private universities and 55 institutions deemed to be universities (Table 1.1).

It is assumed that all those universities that had international students reported

the data and thus those not reporting the data do not have international students on their campuses. It may be mentioned that mostly all universities that had presence of international students responded and submitted the data on international students. Hence the number of universities not returning the filled up data tools are invariably those which do not have international students on their campus. Still, accounting for the fact that there could have been some universities which had international students but did not submit their details to the AIU, the number of international students may, at the most go up by a maximum of 10 percent.

It may be mentioned that this year the data collection tool was thoroughly revised to capture the number of international students from different countries by gender and also by the nature (Full Time or Short-term) and the level (Undergraduate, Postgraduate, Pre-Doctoral and Doctoral) of programme of studies. Besides, the data collection tool also sought information about the facilities that our member universities have to encourage and promote internationalisation of higher education.

Further the tool also sought views/ opinions of the member universities about the barrier that they face in attracting and retaining larger number of international students. In addition to the collation and analysis of the data collected through the primary sources, this volumes also present some critical data on the international mobility of students as obtained from the secondary sources. This is intended to provide the proper perspective and the context to understand the inflow of international students in India.

The Occasional Paper essentially focuses on the mobility of students alone. Thus the mobility of faculty and other forms of internationalisation are beyond the scope of this work. Further, while international mobility of students could include Outward as well as Inward mobility, this occasional paper is largely focused on Inward mobility with only limited data and comments on the outward mobility. It is hoped that the readers, the academic community, the policy planners and the regulators shall find the volume useful.

CHAPTER 2

MACRO TRENDS IN INTERNATIONAL MOBILITY OF STUDENTS

For the purpose of this study, the outward mobility means the number of students going outside the country to pursue their higher education. Outward mobility, thus, essentially means the number of students pursuing higher education outside their home country. The Inward mobility, on the other hand, means the number of international students coming to the country for pursuing their studies in the higher educational institutions of that country.

Outward Mobility of Students: Going by the Project Atlas, presently, nearly 5 Million students world over are studying outside their home countries. The available data reveals that the number of Chinese students studying outside China, which was around 1.2 lakh in

2000 has shot up rapidly to 4.15 Lakh in 2013 and further to 4.60 Lakh in 2014.

So has been the case with regard to the USA where the number of US students outside their country has gone up from 1.54 Lakh to 3.04 Lakh and further to 3.13 Lakh during the same period. As regards India, the number of Indian students pursuing higher studies abroad had risen from 67,000 in 2000 to 2.27 Lakh in 2009 but has since then declined to 1.82 Lakh in 2014 (Table 2.1/Chart 2.1).

Inward Mobility of Students: Inward mobility of students in higher education means the number of international students studying in a country. Analysis of the available data shows that the

Chart 2.1: Number of Students pursuing Higher Education outside their Country

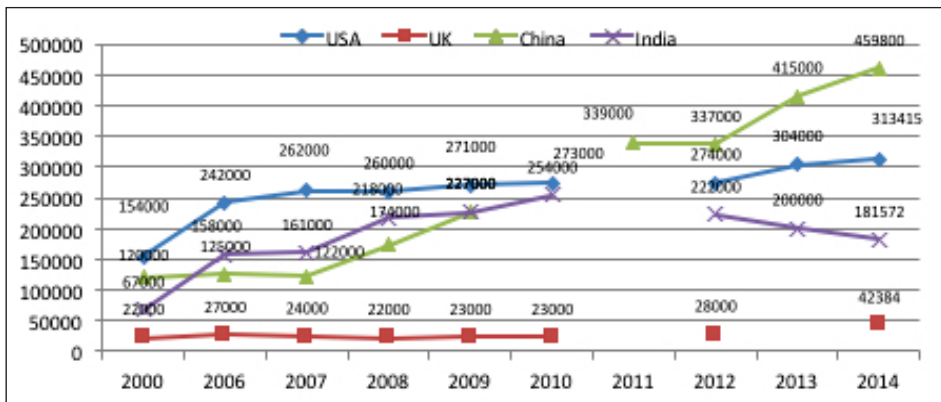

United States of America has continued to remain the most popular destination and the number of international students

studying in USA has consistently been growing and has doubled in 2014 as compared to 2000.

The number of international students going to the United Kingdom has also more than doubled during the same period, though in absolute terms, the number are significantly smaller than those of the US. Most strikingly, the China has surpassed Australia as in 2014 it attracted 3.77 Lakh international students whereas the number of international students going to Australia has been no more than 2.7 Lakh (Chart 2.2).

International Students in India: A Trend Analysis

India, with only 30,423 international students in 2014 has been attracting only a fraction of international students, though the number has gone up from a mere 7,791 in 2000. The share of India in the internal students has been abysmally low at only 0.61%. This is, however, not to suggest that the number of international students coming to India have been stagnant or have not been growing. But a trend analysis since 1986 shows that the numbers have seen ups and downs. In 1986, the number of international students in India were 10,877 which rose to 13,707 in 1993. After that the numbers

started declining and touched an all time low of 5,323 in 1998. Since then, the numbers have been increasing to touch 30,423 in 2014 (Chart 2.3).

Even though the number of international students in India is small compared to many other countries and also in comparison to our own potential, it must be a matter of satisfaction that the number of countries from where the international students have been coming to India has consistently risen from about 60 in 1986 to about 149 in 2014.

International Students from all the continents came to India but students from Asia and Africa dominate. The proportion of students from Asia, which was about 48 percent in 1995 has now gone up to 60 percent in 2014. African students which in 1995 constituted nearly 40 percent of the student population has now been reduced to about 20 percent. Over the period, the number of students from Americas have also more than doubled but the numbers still around thousand and in the case of Europe, number is still remain in hundred (Chart 2.4).

Chart 2.2: Number of International Students in different Countries

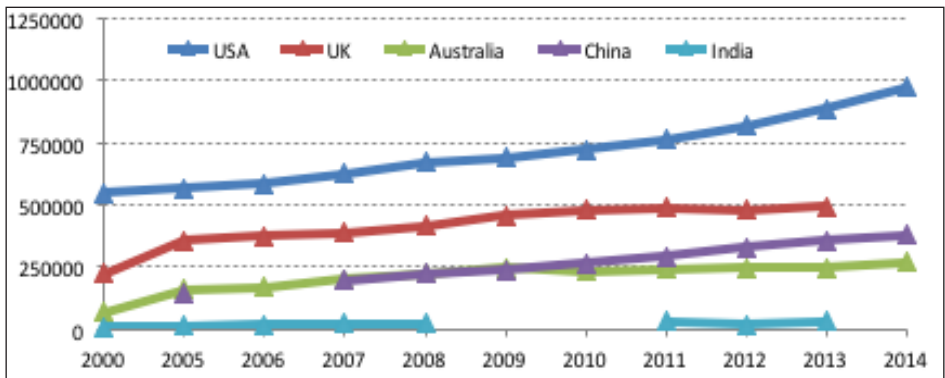


Chart 2.3: International Students in India

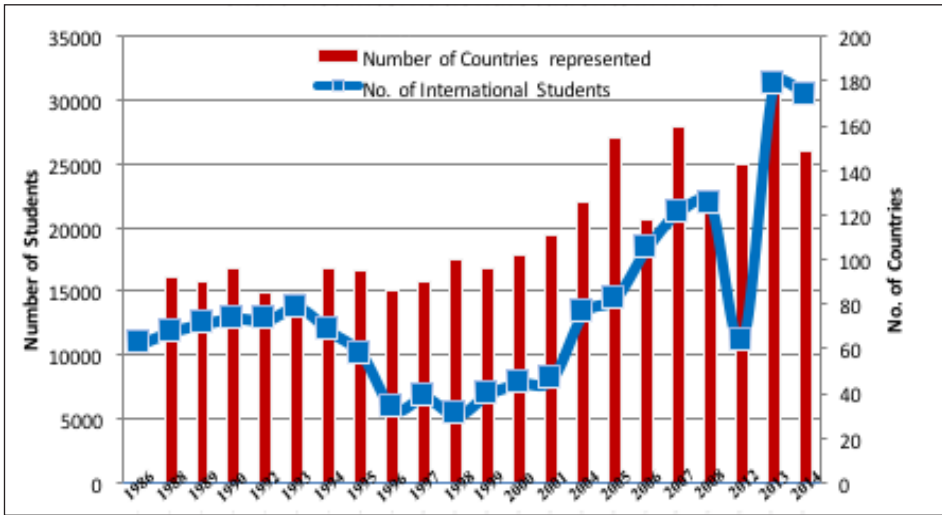
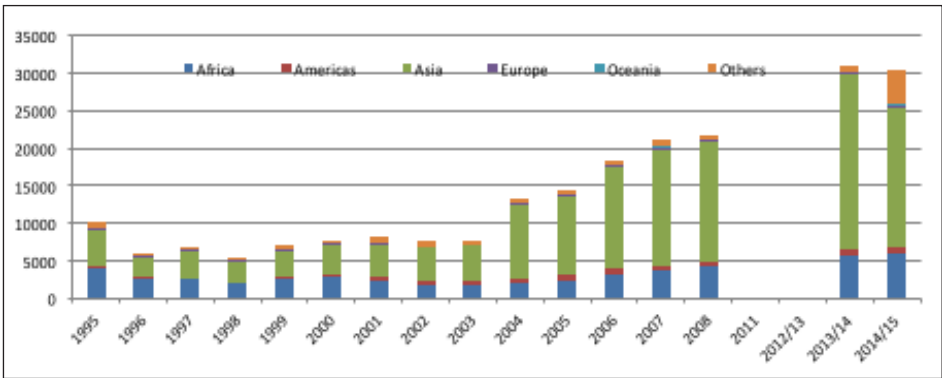


Chart 2.3: International Students in India : Continent wise



While the number of universities reporting presence of international students on their campuses and colleges affiliated thereto have gone up over a period of time, their number has never been more than 208.

Table 2.3: Number of Universities by the Number of International Students Besides, the number of international

students in most universities have been very low. The number of universities reporting 300 or more international students have during different years varied in the range of 5 in 2000 to 23 in 2014. Bulk of the universities have been reporting less than 20 international students on their campuses including those enrolled in colleges affiliated to them (Table 2.3).

CHAPTER 3

SOURCES OF INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS IN INDIA

This chapter presents a comprehensive analysis of the sources of international students in India. The essential idea is to inform the reader, policy planners and the member universities of Association of Indian Universities (AIU) about the potential sources of international students. The chapter is divided into various sections. Section 1 deals with continent-wise data of international students in India. Section 2 presents a detailed analysis of international students in India from Africa and this section not only discusses Africa as a whole but also gives a fairly good idea of students coming from different regions in Africa and also from various countries of Africa. Section 3 is devoted to the analysis of international students coming to India from Americas including various regions and different countries in the Americas. Section 4 of this chapter gives a thorough analysis of international students coming to India from different regions and countries of Asia. Section 5

of this chapter is devoted to the inflow of international students from various regions and countries of Europe. Section 6 gives an analysis of international students coming to India from Oceania. Non Resident Indian (NRI), Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) and the Overseas Citizens of India (OCI) constitute a significant portion of the international students in India. Hence Section 7 of this chapter presents an analysis of such students studying in India. Towards the end, in Section 8 of this Chapter, an attempt has been made to identify foremost sources of international students in India. This section presents the name of countries from where the highest number of international students came to India during the period of this study. This chapter is essentially intended to help out member universities better target and prepare themselves for attracting and retaining international students.

SECTION 1

CONTINENT WISE DISTRIBUTION OF INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS IN INDIA

Total Number: The international students studying in India during the academic year 2014-15 came from as many as 208 countries from across all continents, though a predominant proportion accounting for nearly 60 percent were found to be from Asia followed by Africa which accounted for about 20 percent of the total international students in India. Americas, Europe, Oceania and the persons of Indian origin and the non-resident Indian account for only 20 percent of the international students studying in India (Table 3.1).

Gender-wise Distribution: On an average 35 percent of the international students are women but the proportion of women students varies significantly in case of international students from different continents. Amongst the Asians and the Africans the proportion of

women students is the lowest at 24 and 32 percent whereas a significantly larger proportion of students from Americas (56.73%), Europe (48.98 %) and Oceania (60.87 %), are women (Table 3.1).

Programme-wise Distribution: Most of the international students (71.22%) pursue undergraduate education followed by the postgraduates (21 percent). Those pursuing doctoral and other programmes are no more than 4.22 and 3.26 percent respectively. There are, however, significant variations in the preferences of international students from different continents.

While a predominant proportion (87.07 %) of NRI/PIO students pursue undergraduate programmes, the proportion of undergraduates is comparatively lower in case of students

coming from America (72.80%), Asia (70.24%) Africa (63.25%), Oceania (62.32%), Europe (55.31%). Obviously, the proportion of students pursuing postgraduate programme was relatively higher in case of students coming from Africa (26.77%), Asia (23.49%), Europe (14.69%) and Oceania 10.14%). Amongst the African and European students 7.52 and 5.92 percent respectively came to India to pursue their PhD degrees (Table 3.2).

Table 3.2: Continent-wise Number of International Students in India by Programme Studies It is also interesting to note that while most of the international students (97.06%) came to pursue their programmes of studies as full time regular students, a significantly larger proportion of students from Europe (50.82%), America (29.14%) and Oceania (28.99%) pursued short-duration programmes in India.

SECTION 2

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS FROM AFRICA

Of all the regions in Africa, the largest proportion (49.25%) of students came from the Eastern Africa followed by the Western Africa (26.48%) and Northern Africa (11.62%) The Middle and Southern Africa accounts for 9.52 and 3.13 percent of the total African students studying in India (Table 3.3).

Women students from Africa were found to be 24.08 percent with significant variations across different regions in Africa. The data shows that 48.91 percent of the students coming from Southern Africa were women followed by Eastern Africa (27.28%), Western Africa

(21.26%) and Middle Africa (19.64%). On an average 63.25 percent of the students from Africa pursued undergraduate programmes in India. Going by various regions in Africa, a significantly higher proportion of students from Middle Africa (89.11%), Southern Africa (75.54%) and Western Africa (73.22%) pursued undergraduate education. Similarly, while on average 26.77 percent of the African students pursued postgraduate studies, the preference for postgraduate education was higher in case of students from Northern Africa (38.21%) and Eastern Africa (29.28%). Importantly, 14.06 and 10.43 percent of the students from Northern Africa and Eastern Africa respectively pursued their research degrees as compared to the average of 7.52 percent for the Africa as a whole. As expected, nearly all of the students from Africa pursue their higher education as a full time regular students as the percentage pursuing short-term programmes was as low as 1.09 percent. [Table 3.4].

The subsequent paragraphs present region-wise and country-wise number of international students on Indian campuses:

Eastern Africa:

Eastern Africa accounts for the largest

chunk of international students coming to India from Africa as 49.25 percent of the African students are from Eastern Africa. As many as 2,896 international students in India are from Eastern Africa. These students came from as many as 19 countries. A few countries that account for a larger share include Ethiopia (with 815 students), Tanzania (492), Somalia (254), Kenya (228), Zambia (216), Mauritius (184), Rwanda (150), South Sudan (118) and Uganda (91). International students from Eastern Africa are generally male (72.72%). However, the proportion of female students was significantly higher in case of students coming from Zimbabwe (48.48%), Mauritius (47.28%) and Seychelles (46.67%). [Table 3.5]

As regards programme-wise distribution, international students from Eastern Africa pursue undergraduate (55.97%),

postgraduate (29.28%), Doctoral (10.43%) and other (4.32%) programmes. Further, most students from Eastern Africa pursue their higher education in India as a full time regular student. However, students from different countries of Eastern Africa have varied preferences with regards to the level as well as mode of study [Table 3.6].

Middle Africa:

International students from the Middle African countries were only 560 from as many as 7 countries with the highest numbers coming from Democratic Republic of Congo (43.57%) followed by

the Congo Republic (29.11%). Nearly a fourth of the students from Middle Africa are women with relatively larger number of women from countries like Gabon (37.50%), Congo Republic (34.71%). From Congo, Democratic Republic (25.7%) and Cameroon (10.87%) [Table 3.7].

On an average 89.11 percent of the students from Middle Africa pursue undergraduate programmes and another 8.75 percent study postgraduate programmes of studies. The proportion enrolled for doctoral programme is negligible. [Table 3.8].

Northern Africa:

Students from 7 countries of Northern Africa totalling 683, predominantly male, received their higher education in India. Sudan and Libya were sending the highest and the second highest number of students to India as the number of students from these two countries were 360 and 298 respectively. These were followed by Egypt with only 14 students). Highest number of female students are from Egypt (27.27%) followed by Libya (20.16%), Africa (16.67%) and Sudan (12.85%) respectively (Table 3.9).

All students from Northern Africa, with an exception of just one, pursue their higher education as a full time regular students in India. About 46.85 per cent of them pursue undergraduate programme while those enrolled for the postgraduate and doctoral programmes work out to 38.21 and 14.06 percent respectively. [Table 3.10]

Southern Africa:

As regards Southern Africa, 184 students from 6 countries were reported to be pursuing their higher education in India.

Amongst the Southern African countries, most students came from South Africa (51.63%), followed by the Namibia (25%). Women student comprise 48.91 percent of the student population with four countries of Southern Africa having larger representation of women. [Table 3.11].

Nearly 75.54 percent of the students from Southern Africa are enrolled in the undergraduate programmes whereas the proportion enrolled for the postgraduate

and the doctoral programme is 23.37 and 0.54 percent respectively. Almost all students from Southern Africa pursue their higher education in India as a full time regular students [Table 3.12]

Western Africa:

Nigeria stands out prominently amongst 15 countries of the Western African countries as 1202 students from Nigeria were studying in India during 2014-15. Other prominent countries of Western

SECTION 3

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS FROM AMERICAS

Of the 1033 students coming to India from various regions of America, 94.97 percent came from Northern America meaning United States of America and Canada. Those coming from regions like Caribbeans, Central America and the South America were very small in number ranging between 14 and 20 [Table 3.15]

Even though the number of students coming to India from Americas are small, a relatively larger proportion (56.73%) were women. The proportion of women students was in fact as high

as 71.43 percent in case of those coming from Central America.

While on an average 72.80 percent of the students coming from Americas pursued undergraduate studies in India, more than 66.67 percent of the students coming from Caribbean pursued postgraduate programmes. Further, while 70.86 percent of the American students pursued full-time regular programmes, as many as 30.38 percent of the international students from Northern America preferred to pursue short term programmes in India [Table 3.16].

Caribbean:

Amongst the Caribbean countries, the largest number of students (14) came from the Guyana whereas there were only 4 students from Jamaica and just one from the Antigua and Barbuda. Percentage of female students from Guyana is 50.00% and Jamaica 25.00% [Table 3.17].

In terms of the programmes of studies, a majority of students from Caribbean pursued postgraduate degrees as a full time regular students. [Table 3.18].

Central America:

There were only 14 students from only 2 countries of the Central America out of which as many as 13 were from Mexico alone. In sharp contrast to other countries, as many as 71.4 percent of the students from Central America were women (Table 3.19).

Most international students from Central America were enrolled in the undergraduate programmes, though one or two were also enrolled in the doctoral and other programme of studies. [Table 3.20].

Northern America:

Within America, the largest number of international students came to India from Northern America. Within North America, the largest number of students (753) came from the United States of America (USA) followed by Canada (223). From this region the number of female students were reported to be more than the male students [Table 3.21].

Amongst the international students

from Northern America, 73.70 percent were in enrolled in the undergraduate programme whereas those registered for the postgraduate and doctoral programmes were 4.59 and 1.22 percent respectively. About 20.49 percent of the international students from Northern America were found doing other kinds of programmes of studies and, therefore, nor surprisingly, 30.38 percent of the students from North America were registered for short duration programmes in India [Table 3.22].

SECTION 4

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS FROM ASIA

Asia is the largest source of international students in India with nearly 60 percent of all the international students in the country. Within Asia, the largest numbers of international students (55.74%) come from South Asia followed by the Western Asia (26.57%) and Southeast Asia (10.50%). Contrary to the expectations, the lowest numbers (0.95%) came from Central Asia [Table 3.25].

Broadly, 32.89 percent of the international students coming from Asia are women. Within the Asia, the largest proportion of women students (53.22%) came from Southern Asia followed by East Asia (45.63%) and Central Asia

(42.53%). Enrolment in the undergraduate level averaged at 70.24 percent for the students from Asia but the proportion of the undergraduate students was the highest (81.86%) in case of the students from Southeast Asia. As regards the postgraduate programmes, the proportion was markedly higher (35.10%) in case of the students coming from Western Asia. PhD students accounted for 3.74 percent of Asian students but nearly a tenth of the students from Western Asia were found doing their research degree in India [Table 3.26].

Central Asia:

As regards Central Asia, India received only 174 students of which as many as 71 were from Turkmenistan alone followed by Uzbekistan from where 43 students were reported studying in India. This region has 42.53% female students [Table 3.27].

Nearly 70.11 percent of the international students from Central Asia pursued undergraduate studies and only about 17.67 percent were reported enrolled for the postgraduate programme. Just about 12.07 percent of the Central Asian students were registered for short duration programmes and a dominant majority of them were enrolled as a full

time regular students [Table 3.28]

East Asia:

As many as 1144 international students from East Asia were reported studying in India with Tibet (532), China (276) and South Korea (120) being the top most countries. In this region 45.6 percent female students are there [Table 3.29].

Most of the international students from East Asia were enrolled in the undergraduate programmes (74.74%) with only 15.73 and 2.45 percent registered for the postgraduate and the research degree programme respectively [Table 3.30].

South Asia:

South Asian countries constitutes 56 percent of the international students from Asia with Nepal and Afghanistan being the biggest beneficiaries. Overall,

nearly 27 percent of the international students from South Asia were women, the proportion varied significantly across different countries of South Asia. In fact the proportion of female students in case of Maldives and Sri Lanka was as high

as 57.82 and 52.07 percent respectively [Table 3.31]

In terms of programmes of studies, while 77.91 percent of the students from South Asia studies undergraduate programmes, those registered for postgraduate and doctoral programmes were about 16.77 and 4.34 percent respectively. [Table 3.32].

Southeast Asia:

As regards Southeast Asia, Indian universities received as many as 1924 international students from as many as

10 countries. The biggest chunk (70.53%) came from Malaysia alone. Majority of the international students from Southeast Asia (53.22%) were women and in case of students from countries like Singapore women students constituted as high as 67.3 percent. [Table 3.33].

Western Asia:

International students from as many as 16 countries falling under Western Asia were reported to be pursuing their higher education in India. Top 5 countries of West Asia included Iran (837), Iraq (755), United Arab Emirates (650), Yemen (632), Saudi Arabia (541), and Oman (481). These are followed by Kuwait (329), Qatar (247) and Bahrain

(197). Female students from three countries of Western Asia are less than 10 percent [Table 3.35].

In terms of programmes of studies, only 53.37 percent students from the Western Asia were pursuing undergraduate programmes whereas those pursuing postgraduate and doctoral programmes were 35.10 and 9.84 percent respectively [Table 3.36].

SECTION 5

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS FROM EUROPE

Universities in India attracted as many as 490 international students from Europe of which the largest contingent (42.65%) came from Northern Europe followed by the Western Europe (39.59%). The number of students coming from the Eastern and Southern Europe were no more than 59 and 28 respectively. [Table 3.37]

Number of female students coming to India from Europe is almost same as male students which constitute 49.0% of the total number of students. Importantly, the proportion of women students was relatively higher for those coming from Northern Europe (54.5%) and Eastern Europe (54.2%).

While just about 55.31 percent of the international students from Europe pursued undergraduate and another 14.69 and 5.92 percent pursued the postgraduate and the doctoral programmes respectively. Importantly, nearly a fourth of the international students from Europe came to pursue other programmes of studies. While details could not be collected from the universities it is guessed that they might have been pursuing various kinds of certificates and diploma programmes. This is borne out of the fact that as many as 51 percent of the international students from Europe pursued short-term programmes of studies [Table 3.38].

Eastern Europe:

As regards Eastern Europe, only 59 students from 5 countries were reported to be studying in India with Czech Republic and Russia sending as many as 25 students each. Women enrolment constituted about 54.24 percent of the total enrolment from the Eastern Europe [Table 3.39].

About 55.93 percent of the students from Eastern Europe pursued undergraduate programme as against 13.56 and 8.47 percent which respectively studied for the postgraduate and doctoral programmes [Table 3.40].

Northern Europe:

The survey finds that only 209 international students from as many as 9 Northern European countries came to India for their higher education. United Kingdom (UK) appears to be the largest contributor with 143 students in India. Female students comprised 54.55 percent of the total international students from Northern Europe [Table 3.41].

In terms of programmes of studies, nearly 65 percent of the students from Northern Europe were found registered for undergraduate programmes. Most

Southern Europe:

India also received, albeit in a very small number, international students from 6 countries representing Southern Europe. Of the 28 students from this region, as many as 13 were from Italy followed by

Spain from where 10 students came to India to undertake their higher studies. Female students are 42.86 percent in this region [Table 3.43].

Of the 28 students from Southern Europe, as many as 18 (64.29%) were doing undergraduate programmes and importantly, 23 (82.14%) were pursuing their studies on full time regular basis [Table 3.44].

Western Europe:

Survey finds that only 194 students from the Western Europe were pursuing their higher education in India. Though these students came from 6 different countries, France with 96 students and Germany with 58 students occupy the top two positions. The numbers from the rest of the countries were around 15. Percentage of female students is 42.27% in this region [Table 3.45].

As was the case with Northern Europe, only about 43 percent of the students from Western Europe pursued their undergraduate studies in India. The proportion of the postgraduate and the doctoral programmes was about 20 and 4 percent respectively. As nearly 32.47 percent of the students from Western Europe were found pursuing other kind of programmes, as many as 66 percent of them were attending only short duration programme in India [Table 3.46].

SECTION 6

International Students in India from Oceania

International Students in India from Oceania was just 138. Of these, the highest (60.14%) numbers came from Australia followed by Fiji (23.91%) and New Zealand (7.97%). The number of international students from the other countries namely Papua New Guinea, Samoa and Tuvalu were just minuscule [Table 3.47].

As many as 60.87 percent of the international students from Oceania were found to be women. The proportion of women students was even higher

in case of those coming from Samoa (100%), Tuvalu (100%) and Papua New Guinea (71.43%) Programme-wise distribution of international students from Oceania reveals that 62.32 percent students pursue undergraduate programmes while 10.14 percent of them pursue postgraduate education in India. Interestingly, nearly 26 percent of them pursue other programmes of studies and not surprisingly, nearly 29 percent of the pursue short-term programmes on Indian campuses [Table 3.48].

SECTION 7

NRI/PIO/OCI STUDENTS IN INDIA

In addition to the international students from different regions and countries of the world, Indian universities also attract a fairly large number of international students belonging to the Indian diaspora. These students are classified as the Non resident Indians (NRIs), Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs) and the Overseas Citizens of India (OCIs). These students are given preferential treatments and are charged differential/higher fees. This year the number of such students was

as high as 4557 with nearly 47 percent of them being women students [Table 3.49].

Over 87 percent of the NRI/PIO/OCI students were reported to be studying in undergraduate programmes. The proportion enrolled for the postgraduate and doctoral programme was only 9.94 and 2.35 percent respectively [Table 3.50].

CHAPTER 4

DESTINATION OF INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS IN INDIA

The objective of this chapter is to attempt an analysis of the destination of international students in India i.e. the universities where the international students prefer and take admission. This chapter is divided into three sections: Section 1 of the Chapter presents a comprehensive analysis of

the States and Union Territories where international students are located. Section 2 presents an analysis of the various kinds of universities in which international students study and Section 3 of the Chapter seeks to identify the best universities in terms of international students.

SECTION 1

STATEWISE DISTRIBUTION OF INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS IN INDIA

Universities in as many as 27 States/ Union Territories were reported to be the host to international students. Karnataka stand out to occupy the first place with 25.86 percent of all the

international students in the country, followed by Maharashtra (15.18%), Delhi (14.95%), Uttar Pradesh (10.42%), Tamil Nadu (7.56%) and Tripura (7.13%) in that order [Table 4.1].

A glance at the gender-wise distribution of international students reveals that while on average 34.52 percent of the international students are women, a relatively higher proportion of women prefer to pursue their studies in States

like Mizoram (75.0%), Chhattisgarh (53.97%), Jammu & Kashmir (50%), Sikkim (46.38%), Rajasthan (45.40), Delhi (44.71%) and Karnataka (44.34%) [Table 4.2].

Even though about 71.22 percent of the international students in India pursue undergraduate programmes, the proportion was found to be significantly higher in case of the international

students studying in universities located in Bihar (100%), Jharkhand (95.60%), Sikkim (89.86%) and Punjab (87.16%). [Table 4.3]

Similarly, while about 21.29 percent of the international students pursue postgraduate programmes, the proportion of such student is markedly higher for those studying in Jammu & Kashmir (92.86%), Uttarakhand (44.90%), Delhi (41.30%) and Meghalaya (35.71%).

Also, while 4.22 percent of the international students pursue their doctoral degrees in India, the proportion of such students is quite high in case of

those studying in Meghalaya (64.29%), Chandigarh (37.67%), Kerala (32.74%) and Mizoram (25%).

While only about 2.94% percent of the international students pursue short duration programmes in India, the proportion of such students was tremendously higher in case of those going to Odisha (70.83%) and West Bengal (12.27%), Sikkim (8.70%) and Telangana (7.24%). [Table 4.4]

International students studying in various States/Union Territories are enrolled in various kinds of universities and university level higher educational institutions [Table 4.5].

On average, 17.10 percent of the international students study in Central Universities but the proportion of such students is significantly higher in case

of those studying in Meghalaya (100%), Tripura (100%), Delhi (93.89%), Mizoram (75%) and West Bengal (59.09%).

Similarly, while about 24.89 percent of the international students study in the Deemed Universities, their proportion is quite high in case of those going to Jharkhand (100%), Odisha

(94.44%), Tamil Nadu (85.65%), Haryana (53.26%), Maharashtra (44.56%) and Rajasthan (40.19%). No more than 2.74 percent of the international students were found enrolled in the Institutions of National Importance (INIs) but the proportion of such students was significantly higher for those enrolled in Assam (75%), Uttarakhand (27.55%), West Bengal (23.64%), Andhra Pradesh (13.06%), Himachal Pradesh (12.50%) and Kerala (8.85%)

Private Universities attracted about 18.97 percent of the international students in India. However, the number of international students in private universities was markedly higher in case of those going to States like Punjab (81.85%), UP (80.35%), Madhya Pradesh (78.64%), Sikkim (78.26%) and Himachal Pradesh (56.25%).

The national average of 36.30 percent of the international students preferring to study in the State Universities apart, a significantly larger proportion of the international students in certain States were found enrolled in the State Universities. These include Chandigarh (100%), Jammu & Kashmir (100%), Chhattisgarh (98.41%), Kerala (89.38%), Gujarat (89.15%), Telangana (87.92%), Bihar (80%) and Andhra Pradesh (78.54%) [Table 4.5].

Andhra Pradesh:

Andhra Pradesh, as mentioned earlier is host to 1011 international students in the country. These students are enrolled in 10 universities. Of these 571 international students were enrolled in the Andhra University, Waltair alone. Acharya Nagarjuna University reported to have 192 international students followed by the NIT Warangal (132) [Table 4.6].

Assam:

Universities in Assam reported to have only 185 international students. Of these, 140 were reported to be enrolled in NIT Silchar followed by Dibrugarh University (13) whereas two universities Assam Don Bosco University and Gauhati University had 11 international students each and Tezpur University and Assam Agricultural University had 7 and 3 respectively [Table 4.7].

Bihar:

Bihar was found to be host to 10 international students across 2 universities. Of these as many as 8 students were enrolled in B. N. Mandal

University followed by Nalanda University (2) [Table 4.8].

Chandigarh:

Chandigarh had 292 international students and they were all enrolled in the Panjab University [Table 4.9]

Chhattisgarh:

There were only 63 international students enrolled in Chhattisgarh, of which as many as 62. Similarly, only 3 universities in Chhattisgarh reported to have 63 international students in all out of which 62 were enrolled in the Indira Kala Sangeet University Khairagarh [Table 4.10].

Delhi with 4547 international students is home to the third largest number of international students in the country. Bulk (3022) of these enrolments are in the Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU). University of Delhi with 1180 international students

reports the second largest concentration of international students in Delhi and is followed, though with a very wide margin, by National Institute of Fashion Technology, Delhi (101), Indian Institute of Technology Delhi (71), Jawaharlal Nehru University (67) and Guru Govind Singh Indraprastha University (63) [Table 4.11].

Kerala:

Number of international students in Kerala are just 81 and these students were reported from 6 universities. Highest number of international students are reported from the University of Calicut (58) followed by Sree Chitra Tirunal Institute for Medical Sciences and Technology (10) and Kerala Agricultural University Thrissur. Three universities in Kerala had no more than 2 international students. [Table 4.18].

Maharashtra:

Maharashtra with 4618 international students across 23 universities is the second most popular destination for the international students in India. Telangana:

Telangana, formerly included in Andhra Pradesh but now a separate State, has been host to 2169 international students spread over 6 of its universities. Osmania University with 1787 international students tops the list. University of Hyderabad comes next with 218 international students. SECTION 2

UNIVERSITYWISE DISTRIBUTION OF INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS IN INDIA

It has been mentioned in the earlier chapters that as many as 208 universities in the country had international students on their campuses.

A closer look on the data, however, reveals that just 10 universities in country have international students in excess of 1000. The number of universities with 500 or more international students are no more than 15 [Table 4.31]

Further analysis of the data reveal that only a couple of Central Universities, Deemed Universities and Private Universities had more than 1000 international students on their campuses. Obviously, only a small number of international students study

in a large number of universities and colleges affiliated thereto [Table 4.32].

Taken as a whole, the public funded state universities account for 36.30 percent of all the international students in India followed closely by the deemed universities which account for close to 24.89 percent of all the international students. The central universities and the private universities account for 17.10 and 18.97 percent of the international students [Table 4.33].

Another interesting feature that emerges out of the data is that the central universities, state universities and the institutions of national importance attract relatively larger

CHAPTER 5

FACILITIES FOR & BARRIERS IN INTERNATIONALISATION

This chapter presents the views of the universities on the facilities that they have created for internationalisation and also the barriers that they face in attracting and retaining international students on their campuses.

SECTION 1

FACILITIES FOR INTERNATIONALISATION

This year, AIU, in addition to collecting data on the number of international students, also asked the universities to furnish their views about the various kinds of facilities that they have on their campuses to attract international students. In all 141 universities furnished this information and the same is presented in Table 5.1.

Foreign/International Students Advisors: Only 75.18 percent universities reported to have an office of the foreign/international students advisor.

Marketing and Publicity targeted at International Students: Universities in India do not appear to be very proactive in attracting international students as only 62.41 percent of the universities

reported resorting to marketing and publicity intended towards international students.

Engagement of Professional Consultants for recruiting International Students: Only about 26.24 percent of the universities informed that they engage professional consultants to market their programmes and recruit international students.

Single Window Admission for international students: Nearly 74.47 percent universities reported to have developed and implemented a single window facilitation centres for admission of international students.

Residential facilities for international students: Only about

62.41 percent of the universities with international students have dedicated hostels for international students but about 73.05 percent of them do facilitate residential accommodation for the international students on their campuses.

Financial Support for International Students: International students are charged differential and higher fees as compared to the Indian students but quite a large number of international students, particularly from the Asia come to India on Indian Council of Cultural Relations (ICCR) scholarship. In addition, 45.39 percent of the universities reported to offer scholarship or financial support to international students out of their budget.

Specifically designed programmes for international students: 39.01 percent of the universities with international students on their campuses reported to have designed specialised programmes for the international students.

Other Initiatives by the Universities: In addition to the responses to the structured questions, many universities also reported certain initiatives that they took overtime to promote internationalisation of higher education on their campuses. These

include the following:

The IIS University, Jaipur has a policy in place for international students. The Centre for students provides single window facilities to them.

Karnataka State Law University, Hubli has Overseas Education Centre for foreign students.

Indira Kala Sangeet Vishwavidyalaya, Khairagarh is away from din & bustles of City Life and offers ideal setting for the cultivation of art sense.

One week Free Orientation Programme for new comers is organized by University of Calicut, Calicut.

Extra-curricular programmes are arranged for International Students in Visva Bharati University, Shantiniketan.

Hindustan Institute of Technology & Science, Chennai supports International Students in processing their immigration formalities, provides additional support for academic performance. It provides full fledged Internet lab facilities with air condition to candidates for their study purpose.

Nominees of ICAR are admitted in Dr. Y.S. Parmar University of Horticulture and Forestry.

SECTION 2

BARRIERS TO INTERNATIONALISATION

Often the interaction with the member universities on the issue of internationalisation of higher education flagged the difficulties and problems. This in view, the questionnaire this year sought to gather from the universities their problems and difficulties in attracting international students. In all 112 universities responded to the questionnaire on barriers and difficulties and the same are presented in Table 5.2

Locational Disadvantages was perceived as a barrier by only about 18.07 percent of the universities while the others did not experience any difficulty in attracting international students on

account of their location.

Regulatory restrictions and lack of support from regulatory bodies was also not perceived as a barrier by a large number of universities as only 17.86 and 14.29 percent of them reported them to be a barrier.

Lack of enough applications from international students was reported to be a major stumbling block as over 58.93 percent of the universities reported that they do not receive enough number of quality applications from international students.

Difficulties in Obtaining Visa for Foreign Students was perceived as a barrier by only 20.54 percent of the respondents.

Lack of residential accommodation for international students was perceived as a barrier to internationalisation by only 22.32 percent of the universities.

Lack of quality facilities and infrastructure was perceived as a barrier by only about 11.61 percent of the international students.

Lack of enthusiasm amongst the faculty about international students was reported to be a barrier only in as many as 4.46 percent of the universities.

Lack of enthusiasm amongst the students of the university about international students was perceived as a barrier only by about 9.82 percent of the universities.

Medium of Instructions was a barrier in only about 16.96 percent cases.

Rigidities of the admission system which is often reported to be a major cause for not being able to attract international students was reported to be a barrier by only 9.82 percent of the universities.

Difficulties in recognition of international qualifications was

reported to be a barrier in admitting international students by about 26.79 percent of the universities, even though the AIU facilitates the process by determining equivalence of international qualification.

Other Barriers: In addition to the responses to the structured questions, a few universities also reported other barrier. Some of these include:

ISM University, Dhanbad reported lack of fund to support International Students;

Meenakshi Academy of Higher Learning and Research, Chennai found Habits/ disciplinary problems as a barrier;

Lovely Professional University, Jalandhar reported difficulties with the procedural formalities prescribed by the FRRO Registration;

Maharishi Markandeshwar University, Mullana, Ambala feels that the major barrier in admitting the International Students is the difficulty faced by the students to arrange for the sponsors of their study in the country of residence.

University of Agriculture Sciences, Bangalore is of the opinion that the students don't know English language.

O.P. Jindal Global University, Sonapat reported that they cannot admit much students because of the safety and security concern in India.

CHAPTER 6

CONCLUSION AND IMPLICATIONS

India has tremendous potential to attract international students from all over the world. Sadly our universities have not been able to capitalise on this opportunity. As a result, they are losing out on the advantage of not only generating some revenue but also of making their campuses diverse and thus on creating a global ambience. Most importantly, our campuses are losing out on the opportunity of developing global outlook amongst their students and thus adversely impacting on the much needed task of preparing global citizens. We are also depriving the global community, which is so keen to know and benefit not only from the rich tradition and culture of the country but also getting exposed to India as a modern economy and society and the way it is coping with a variety of challenges.

Realising that the earlier occasional papers brought out by AIU were incomplete because it did not capture and report data on the international students placed in our campuses for short duration visit and study India programme, from this year onward the same has been addressed and the data reported in this occasional paper also reports numbers of international students coming to India for short duration programmes as well.

Similarly, another deficiency in the

previous occasional papers was that they did not capture the reasons of low inflow of international students in the country despite an enabling policy framework for encouraging international students being already in place for over three decades. This too has been addressed from this year onward.

Anecdotal evidences suggest that there is a craving amongst the global community to send their students to India for higher education and also for short-duration visit and exchange. The reasons could be numerous ranging from inadequate or poor physical facilities, lack of systematic efforts to market our higher education and also the perception that the quality of higher education in India, though good as compared to many countries, is still not world class.

Our modified Data Capture Format has now included questions in these regards as well and hopefully from the next year onward, we should be able to present some insight on the difficulties faced by our universities in attracting international students in such a large number that is not only desirable but also possible.

This occasional paper began on the note that with the enabling policy framework in place permitting universities to admit international students on supernumerary

basis, India should have been having nearly 4.8 million international students. This is our potential which when juxtaposed to the reality of a mere 30,423 international students in the country is certainly a sad commentary on the state of affairs.

To be more realistic, since last year only about 5 million international students were reported to be pursuing their higher education out of their countries, it would be an impossibility for India to attract 4.8 Million. What we can, however,

do is to target to increase our share in the global mobility of international students to a more pragmatic 10 percent of the global outflow. This would mean putting in place the strategies, plan and programme of action to host about 5 Lakh international students which could gradually be raised to 20 percent or 10 lakh international students over the next ten years. For these to happen, the higher educational institutions, the regulatory bodies and the government, both at the central as well as at the state level shall have to work in tandem.
