Brief Report on the Workshop

KLE Academy of Higher Education and Research (KAHER) has consistently been at the forefront of medical education and has actively contributed to the growth of higher education since its inception. One such initiative is the establishment of the Academic and Administrative Development Centre (AADC) at KAHER, in collaboration with the Association of Indian Universities (AIU). Both organizations share a common vision of becoming a dynamic service and advisory body in India, driving new initiatives and programs to enhance and globalize Indian higher education. Through this collaboration, KAHER's Academic and Administrative Development Centre (AIU-KAHER AADC), Belagavi, hosted the workshop titled “Artificial Intelligence and Technology: The new allies in empowering educators” from 21st to 25th April 2025. A total of **77 delegates** had participated from various Institutions of the country.

A five-day training program was successfully conducted, engaging faculty members, researchers, and early-career scholars from various disciplines. The workshop aimed to explore the transformative impact of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and emerging technologies on education, with a focus on enhancing teaching methodologies, assessment tools, content creation, and ethical considerations. The event brought together a wide range of experts and educators from different institutions, facilitating in-depth discussions, hands-on training sessions, and collaborative learning experiences.

Day 1: The workshop began with an Inauguration Ceremony at 10:30 AM, where dignitaries emphasized the importance of integrating AI into education. At 11:00 AM, Dr. Avinash Supe delivered the keynote address, “Transforming Learning: Exploring the Evolving Role of AI in Higher Education.” He discussed how AI is reshaping education through personalized



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learning, curriculum design, learning analytics, and mentoring. From 2:30 PM to 4:30 PM, Dr. Smitha Bhat and Dr. Sunita Y. Patil presented “Gamification in Education,” demonstrating how AI-supported game-based learning can boost student engagement, collaboration, and immersive learning.

Day 2: Dr. Rakhi Kallimani led the morning session, “AI for Smart Content Creation,” from 10:00 AM to 12:30 PM. She introduced tools that automate lecture transcription, note generation, and custom study materials, improving teaching efficiency. In the afternoon, Ms. Rithika Talikoti conducted a hands-on session on using AI tools like Microsoft Copilot and Canva for creating dynamic PowerPoint presentations. She highlighted how these tools streamline design and enhance content delivery for educators.

Day 3: The day started with “Assessment in the Era of AI and Technology,” conducted by Dr. Chinmay Shah, Dr. Jyoti Nagmoti, and Dr. Harshal Sabane. They showcased AI-based tools for adaptive testing, real-time feedback, and maintaining academic integrity. From 2:30 PM to 4:30 PM, Dr. Rajakumar Elanjeeran and Dr. Lulu Sherif led a session on “Smart and Scalable Simulation,” focusing on affordable AI, VR, and AR tools. They demonstrated how such simulations offer experiential learning, especially in medical and technical education.

Day 4: This day focused on AI in research. In the morning, Dr. Chinmay Shah presented “AI in the Research Arena,” covering machine learning for data analysis, systematic reviews, and identifying research gaps. In the afternoon, Dr. Harshal Sabane led a session on “AI Tools in Research Publications and Academic Writing.” He introduced tools for literature reviews, reference management, plagiarism checks, and manuscript drafting, stressing their impact on academic productivity.

Day 5: The final day began with “Ethical Considerations: Responsible Use of AI in Education and Research” by Dr. Harshal Sabane. He addressed issues like data privacy, algorithmic bias, and the role of educators in promoting ethical AI usage. The concluding session, “The Future of Lifelong Learning,” was jointly conducted by Dr. Chinmay Shah and Dr. Chetana Sarang Kulkarni. They discussed how AI-driven platforms are transforming continuous education,



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skill enhancement, and career planning. The workshop was a rich learning experience, equipping participants with the knowledge to effectively integrate AI in teaching, assessment, and research. The sessions inspired collaborative discussions and highlighted the path forward in using digital tools responsibly and innovatively in education.



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
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Workshop Feedback Assessment Report
